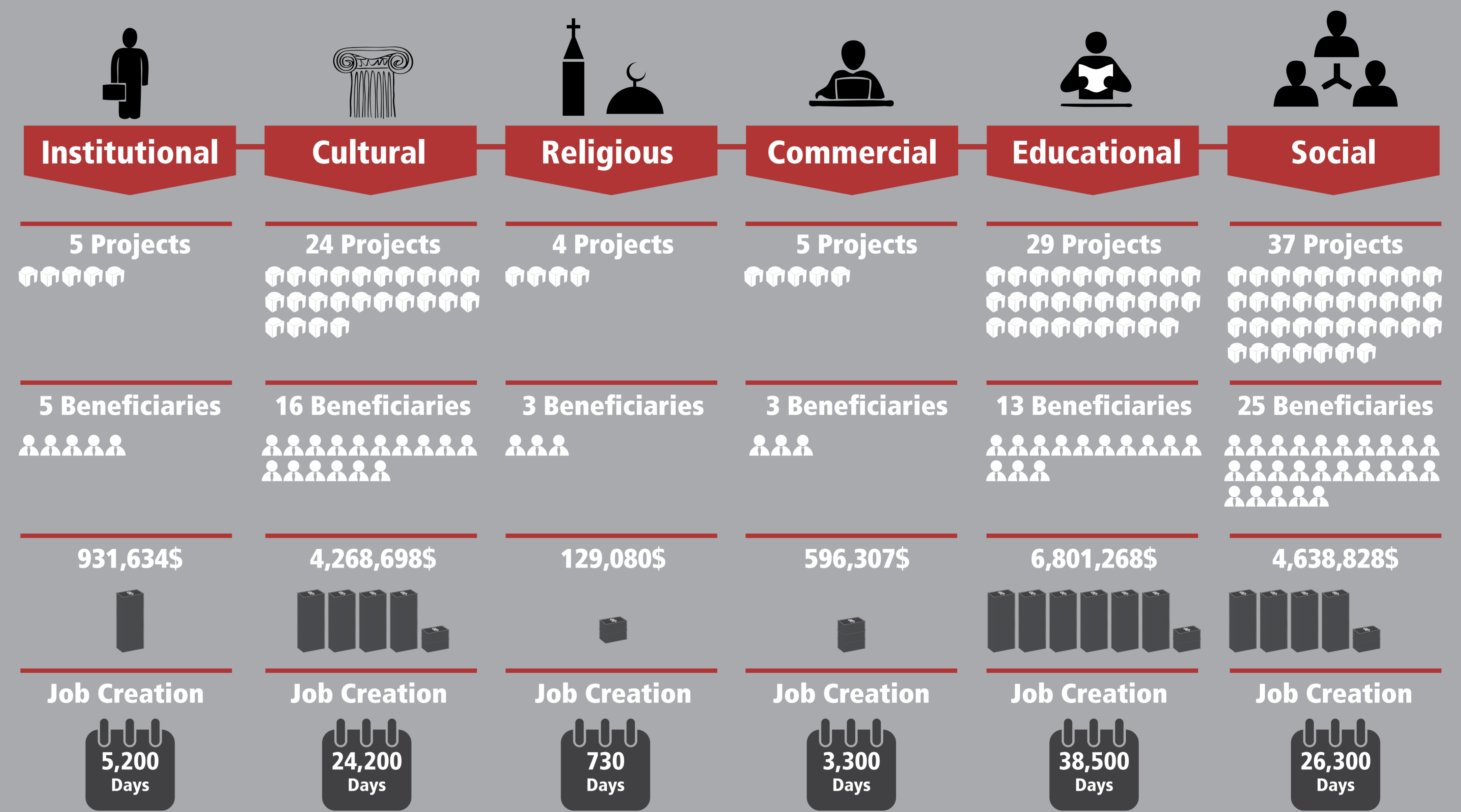

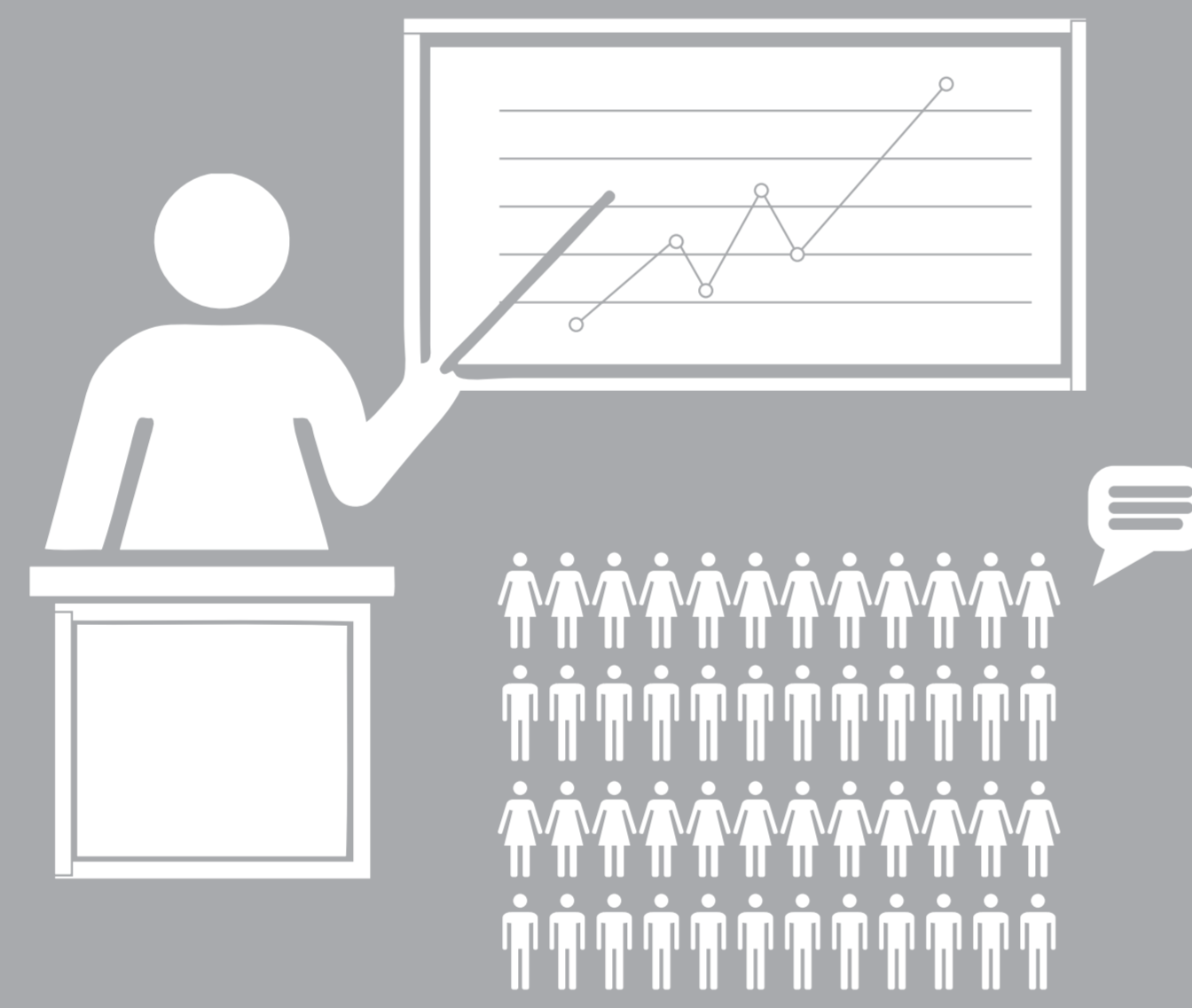

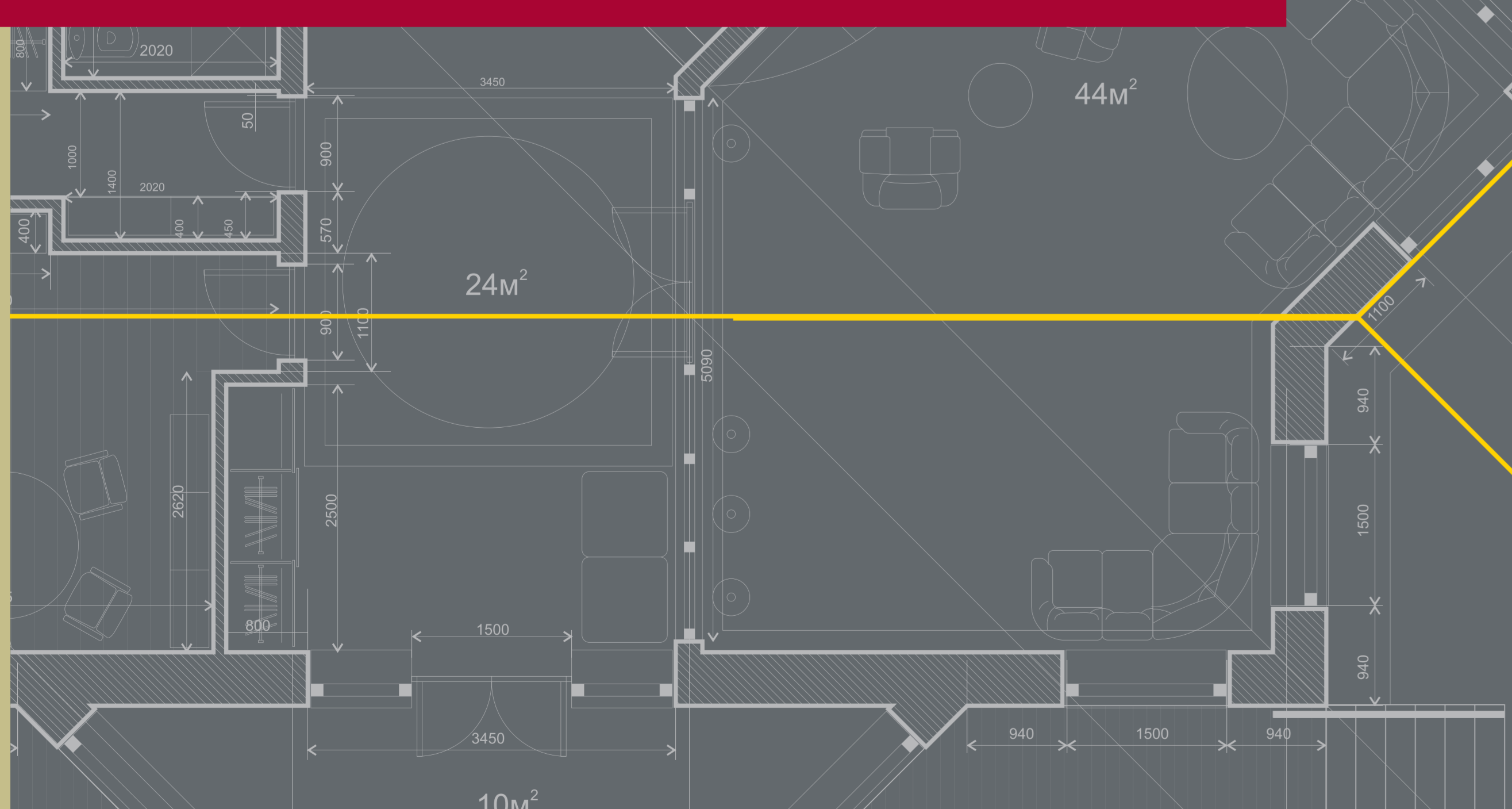


A wide range of community awareness activities conducted during the last years in addition to **events, workshops, seminars, and publications** to raise the awareness of the importance of architectural heritage

PHASE 1

Completion of the first Phase of the Project to establish an Institute for conservation of Architectural Heritage where around 171 Architects and Engineers joined 15 courses conducted through the Institute.



PHASE 2

Implementing the 2nd phase of the Project were short course conducted and the first core course in Nablus completed (14 Architects and Engineers) , 12 Jerusalemite youth completed an apprenticeship programme for craftsmen , number of core courses and intensive short courses planned for 2013/2014
